CSH Virtual Desktop Now Available for Students In Grades 2-12

Students in Lloyd Harbor, West Side and the Jr/Sr High - you can now access your school computer desktop, including your own school home folder (documents and files), from anywhere. All you need is an Internet connection, your own device (PC, Mac, iPad/iPhone or Droid) and a free app.

When you log into the CSH Virtual Desktop, you will be able to open and work with all your school documents...you will also have access to all the programs you use while at school. Started a paper at school and want to continue working on it at home? No problem! Just log into the CSH Virtual Desktop and open and save files as you normally would. You will be accessing the same document regardless of where you are...in school, at home, anywhere. No more thumb drives needed to bring files back and forth. You can even print on your own printer!

REUSE-A-SHOE SNEAKER RECYCLING CAMPAIGN

Don't throw out those smelly, old sneakers...recycle them!

Since it was so popular in its debut last year, West Side families will again have the opportunity to participate in Nike's Reuse-A-Shoe program as a part of Earth Month. The program collects worn-out athletic shoes for recycling. Nearly every part of the shoe will be transformed into Nike Grind, a material used in creating athletic and playground surfaces as well as select Nike products.

Any brand of athletic shoes is accepted. No sandals, flip-flops, dress shoes, boots, or shoes containing metal such as cleats or spikes please.

A collection box will be in the Airplane Lobby through **Monday, April 29**th. You can also donate at the West Side Run. So get training, and then give us your shoes!

The following list shows what part of the shoe and approximately how many pairs of athletic shoes, or the manufacturing equivalent thereof, generally go into making each type of athletic surface:

- Outdoor basketball court (midsole foam): 2,500 pairs
- Outdoor tennis court (midsole foam): 2,500 pairs
- Full field or soccer pitch (outsole rubber): 50,000 75.000 pairs
- Mini soccer field (outsole rubber): 10,000 20,000 pairs
- Running track (outsole rubber): 75,000 pairs
- Playground (outsole rubber): 2,500 pairs
- Indoor wood basketball court (upper fabric): 2,500 pairs
- Indoor synthetic basketball court (midsole foam): 2,500 pairs





How We Do Harm: A Doctor Breaks Ranks About Being Sick in America

by Otis Webb Brawley and Paul Goldberg

Dr. Otis Brawley is the chief medical and scientific officer of The American Cancer Society, an oncologist with a dazzling clinical, research, and policy career. How We Do Harm pulls back the curtain on how medicine is really practiced in America. Brawley tells of doctors who select treatment based on payment they will receive, rather than on demonstrated scientific results; hospitals and pharmaceutical companies that seek out patients to treat even if they are not actually ill (but as long as their insurance will pay); a public primed to swallow the latest pill, no matter the cost; and rising health-care costs for unnecessary—and often unproven—treatments that we all pay for. Brawley calls for rational healthcare, healthcare drawn from results-based, scientifically justifiable treatments, and not just the peddling of hot new drugs.
