

Ingredients

- 1. Fresh Tomatos
- 2. Can of whole tomatos (Muirs Organic whole tomatoes are good)
- 3. Olive oil
- 4. Fresh (or dried) Thyme
- 5. Fresh (or dried) Oregano
- 6. Fresh basil
- 7. Salt and Pepper

Recipe

- 1. Halve tomatos then roast at 350 (drizzle with olive oil, salt and pepper, oregano, and thyme) for 45minutes.
 - Make sure not to overlap tomatos
 - After tomatos come out of the oven you can freeze them and they taste even better later
- 2. Now take your roasted tomatos, a large can or two of **unflavored** and **whole** tomatos, crushed garlic, basil, a bit of oregano, parsley, salt, pepper and put them into a pot.
- 3. Now use your hand mixer to pure the tomato sauce as much as you want (I like a few chunks).
- 4. Heat pot med-high uncovered until the sauce bubbles, then reduce to med-low uncovered until the liquid reduces by an inch or so (or when the thickness gets to your liking).
- 5. After that cover and simmer as long as you like. You can't simmer low long enough.
- 6. The sauce will taste even better as leftovers as the herbs kick in over time.





Student Behavior
