

Principal's Corner

To kick the week off, our Student Council senior staff members pre-recorded Monday morning's announcement for the student body using new technology. Thank you to Sammy Genser, Harley Weiss, Ben Reichbach, and Elijah Farkash for putting this together for our school. Your announcement created a strong buzz about our iPTV system and the newsroom.

In second grade, our students used strategies to solve addition problems, and edited their writing to create complete sentences. Our third graders taught me strategies they are using for odd and even numbers, while others learned about Christopher Columbus. Meanwhile, fourth graders published their writing in the Computer Lab, created class charts about the characters in *Dear Mr. Henshaw*, and learned about New York State in Social Studies. Fifth graders began a character unit called "Following Characters into Meaning." They also practiced Reader's Theatre scripts for performances for the fourth grade. In Science, students spent time with a scientist from the DNA Learning Center and compared plant and animal cells under microscopes. Finally, sixth graders used current event articles as a springboard for a discussion about Halloween and worked with a triple beam balance in Science. They also read and discussed *Maroo of the Winter Caves*.
