### **Principal's Corner**

This week our bus assistants, comprised of 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders, began supporting their peers on the buses. Throughout the fall and early winter months, these student leaders will help teachers locate buses during dismissal, assist younger students when searching for seats, and encourage a healthy atmosphere when riding.

During the school week, our second graders worked on adding thinking to their writing pieces and talked about the qualities of a great reading spot. Third graders focused on building stamina during reader's workshop, found patterns in number lines, and used a map to identify continents and oceans. Fourth graders drafted realistic fiction pieces in writing and honed in on creating characters, adding action, thoughts, feeling, and dialogue. In small groups, fifth graders developed stronger ideas about the main character, Kek, from *Home* of the Brave. They also made distinctions between the different types of decisions people make and what should drive these decisions. They also participated in a science lab about the physics of flight. Sixth graders learned about square numbers as they continued to explore the relationships and patterns between factors. During social studies, they took the perspective of how people of early cultures communicated and its connection to art.

Thank you to all of our parents who attended the first PTG meeting of the year. With standing room only, there was a vibe of enthusiasm for a great year ahead. Also, thank you to Dr. Wilansky for her presentation of West Side School's Reward School award from the New York State Department of Education for the 2014-2015 school year. Finally, our School Improvement Team met for the first time on Thursday to begin planning for our 225th anniversary celebration this spring.
