Weekly Notes-May 20, 2016

Dear Parents,

During a recent unit of study, our kindergarten and first grade students learned and applied high level skills as readers and writers of informational text. They learned about the purpose of nonfiction writing (to inform/teach an audience) and all about its features, such as headings and illustrations with captions.

Our teachers designed lessons to teach our young students how to listen for information and remember the most important facts. They chose interesting, yet simple books to read aloud and engaged the students in discussions about what they were learning. Then they helped them to record key details in their own set of "notes." The notes included sketches, labels, and key vocabulary words to help the students remember "what the author is teaching me." Eventually, the students learned to use their "notes" to compose "All-About Books" on the topic.

The children enjoyed drawing and writing about what they'd learned. They wrote using the "voice" of an expert---teaching their readers "all about" the information they'd learned from a book. The teachers and I marveled at their ability to recall information and retell it in interesting ways! We especially loved to examine the rich detail many of them included in their drawings.

Over the course of the year, our teachers have engaged their students in a study of many different genresnarrative, poetry, procedural, persuasive and informational writing. They have read stories, poems, and articles aloud to help their students understand the many ways writers share their ideas. I know you must be proud of the growth your child has made as a writer this year! I will include suggestions for ways to engage your child in writing at home over the summer in my notes next month.



All participants/groups must fill out an Anything That Floats Race (ATFR) Registration Form for each entry and sign a liability waiver. This event is a creative challenge open to all! We encourage people of all ages to participate and make colorful, standout, fun, exciting, and abstract boats. We support the use of anything recycled and recyclable found in an attic, garage, the recycling bin, etc. Participants must be ready to race when it is their turn and cannot begin racing until signaled to do so by the Race Committee. The race will start from the beach each craft will paddle around several buoys, and return to the beach after crossing the finish line.

There will be three categories of racers:

1. Youth Challenge: Any craft constructed and crewed by one or more children under 14 years of age.

2. School/Group Team Challenge: Two (2) or more constructors/crew per craft

Two divisions

Half the crew are 12 y/o and under

All crew are between 13 to 18 y/o

3. Open Challenge: NO Age or Builder Restrictions.

Requirements:

- Life Jackets must be worn
- Use Recycled materials, such as:
 - o Wood
 - o Cardboard
 - o Cloth
 - o Metal
- The following are not permitted:
 - o Styrofoam of any kind
 - o Rubber
 - o Mechanical propulsion
