Principal's Corner

This week our sixth graders participated in a workshop led by Mrs. Mossey from the Long Island Water Program in preparation for their field trip to the North Shore Land Alliance. In addition, artist-in-residence, Cliff Mendelson shared his expertise and talent as he demonstrated the art of Native American and Mesoamerican vessel making in a workshop for fourth and fifth grade students, a connection to their social studies curriculum. The students enjoyed learning about the process and effort involved in creating ceramic pieces and gained an appreciation for cultures that are unfamiliar to them. They discussed samples of finished works in light of the history of art in various cultures and how its applications are alive in the world today. Students created their own individual clay vessels using the style and techniques of Native American and Mesoamerican cultures including pinch and coil building. The various symbols, patterns and imagery were utilized in their own works to explore this tradition, rich in ceramic history. Students left feeling inspired and proud of their work which will be fired and painted before the end of the school year. Finally, our second and third graders continued to prepare for Symbols of America and International Day performances which will take place next Friday. Looking forward to seeing everyone tonight at the Talent Show. Good luck to all of our performers and thank you in advance to Mrs. Albers and all of our parent volunteers for all of your hard work!

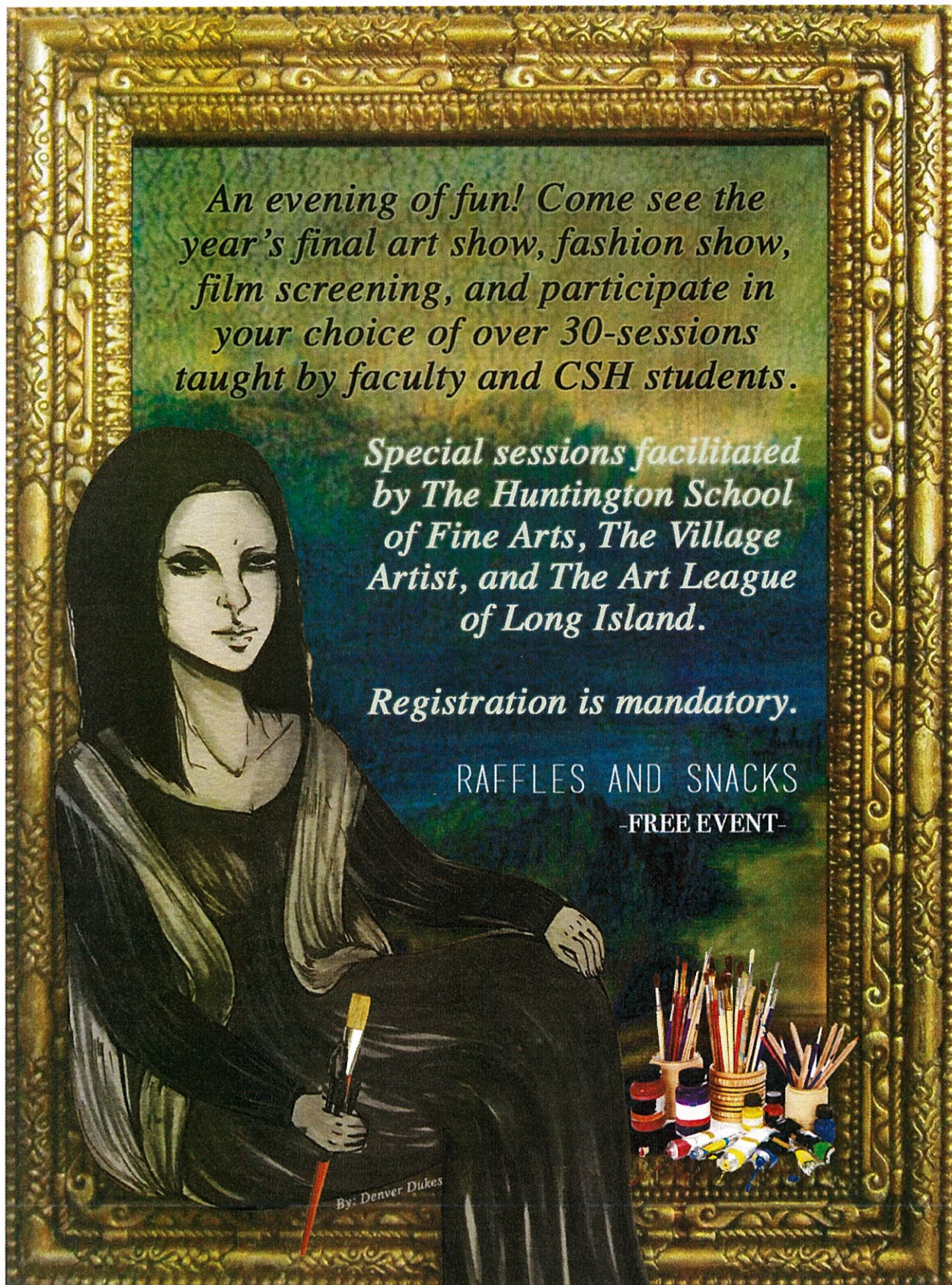

Directions to West Side Run

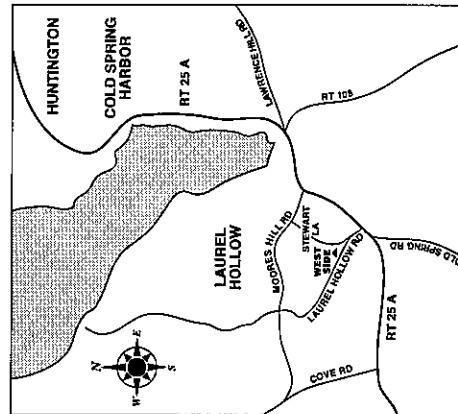
The West Side School is located just one block north of Route 25A in the village of Laurel Hollow, Syosset, NY.

From the West

Take the LIE or Northern State to Route 106. Turn left - North, to Route 25A, Northern Blvd. Turn right - East, on 25A. Continue for 3.2 miles, just past the 4th traffic light, turn left onto Laurel Hollow Road (don't go down the hill on 25A). Follow the signs to the parking area.

From the East

On 25A continue through Huntington and Cold Spring Harbor past the Fish Hatchery, on left, and the Cold Spring Lab, on right, up to the top of the hill on 25A. Turn right on Laurel Hollow Road at the hilltop, *before* the traffic light. Follow the signs to the parking area.

Being Human (entering grades 10–12) Connect the prehistoric world with modern human biology through anthropological labs that will get you up close and personal with your ancient ancestors.

DNA Science (entering grades 10–12) Perform lab experiments in molecular biology, culminating in the construction and cloning of recombinant DNA. Based on our popular DNA Science textbook.



DNA Barcoding (DNA Science alumni entering grades 10–12) Use DNA barcoding in this project-based camp to survey the biodiversity of an ecosystem or uncover food fraud.



BioCoding (DNA Science alumni entering grades 11, 12) Get started in computer programming (coding) and bioinformatics, a growing field in managing and analyzing biological data. No coding experience required!

Genome Science (DNA Science alumni entering grades 11, 12) Use biochemical and computer methods to analyze the genetic component of living things.
