Dear Parents/Guardians:

Beginning next week we will be implementing a new Visitor Management System for anyone entering West Side School. This system is state of the art and will streamline the sign in/out process. It is the same system currently used at the high school.

The new system works as follows: The first time you visit West Side you will be asked to produce a valid New York State Driver's License which will be scanned. A photograph will be taken of the visitor which will be displayed on the visitor's pass. The pass includes the date, time of entry and the location to be visited.

As we move forward with this process, it is imperative that entry and exit are done through the Airplane Wing. The visitor pass has a barcode that must be scanned upon exiting the school to be cleared from the system. Failure to do so will lead to a delay in entering the building upon your next visit to West Side.

The process described above will only apply on the visitor's first entry to West Side and takes only a few minutes. On all subsequent visits, the parent/guardian will simply inform the security officer at the desk of his or her name which will be in the system and a pass will be automatically produced.

We thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation in this matter as the safety of our students is paramount.


CHILDREN'S COSTUME PARADE






