Dear Parents or Guardians:
In the spring of this past school year, the Cold Spring Harbor School District administered the New York State English Language Arts and Math Assessment to all students 3-8. In addition, students in grade 4 were administered New York State Science Assessment.
These scores are results from standardized assessments aligned with the Common Core State Standards. In this regard, these scores reflect a snapshot of performance against rigorous learning standards and are among one of several ways in which student performance is measured.
Students are assigned a performance level based on how they perform on the test. Although there are four possible performance levels, there is a broad range of performance levels (Scale Score) associated with each performance level and within each grade level. A score at performance level 3 or 4 is considered proficient, indicating that the student demonstrates a thorough understanding of the knowledge and skill expected at that grade level and subject area assessed. Students who received a performance level 1 or 2 demonstrated partial understanding of the knowledge and skill expected at that grade level and subject area assessed.
Eligibility for receiving Academic Intervention Services (AIS) continues to be based on annual guidance from the New York State Education Department and District criteria (reading level, classroom performance). These services may take many forms, dependent on the grade level and individual needs of each student, and may range from pre-
