LATE DROP OFFS IN THE FRONT CIRCLE

BRINGING FRIENDS ON A BUS FOR PLAYDATES

As you know, many of our buses are quite full. Therefore, as previously shared, we can only allow a student to bring home one or two friends on his/her bus. If you have an extenuating circumstance, please call the office so we can try to accommodate your request.

EARLY PICK-UP

If you need to pick up your child before regular dismissal, you must be here before 2:45PM. All pick-ups after that time will occur at the back circle due to the arrival of the buses and traffic flow.

DISMISSAL PICK-UP

If you pick up your child at dismissal, you must go to the back circle. Please wait in line, or, if you are here early enough and find an empty parking space, you may park and walk to the circle doors to meet your child.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

If your preschool child will be 5 years old on or before December 1, 2016, he/she is eligible for kindergarten in September 2016. Please contact the District Registrar, Gloria Albert, (631 367-5910) to ensure that your child's name appears on the District census. Only those families whose child's name appears on the census will receive a registration packet from the Superintendent. Registration begins in February.

Lost & Found

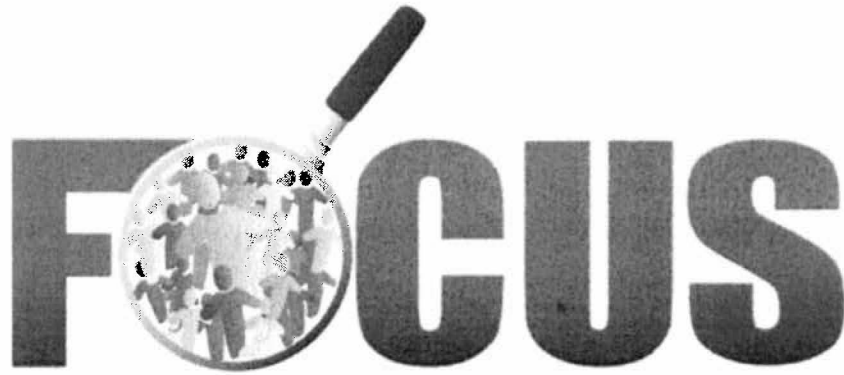

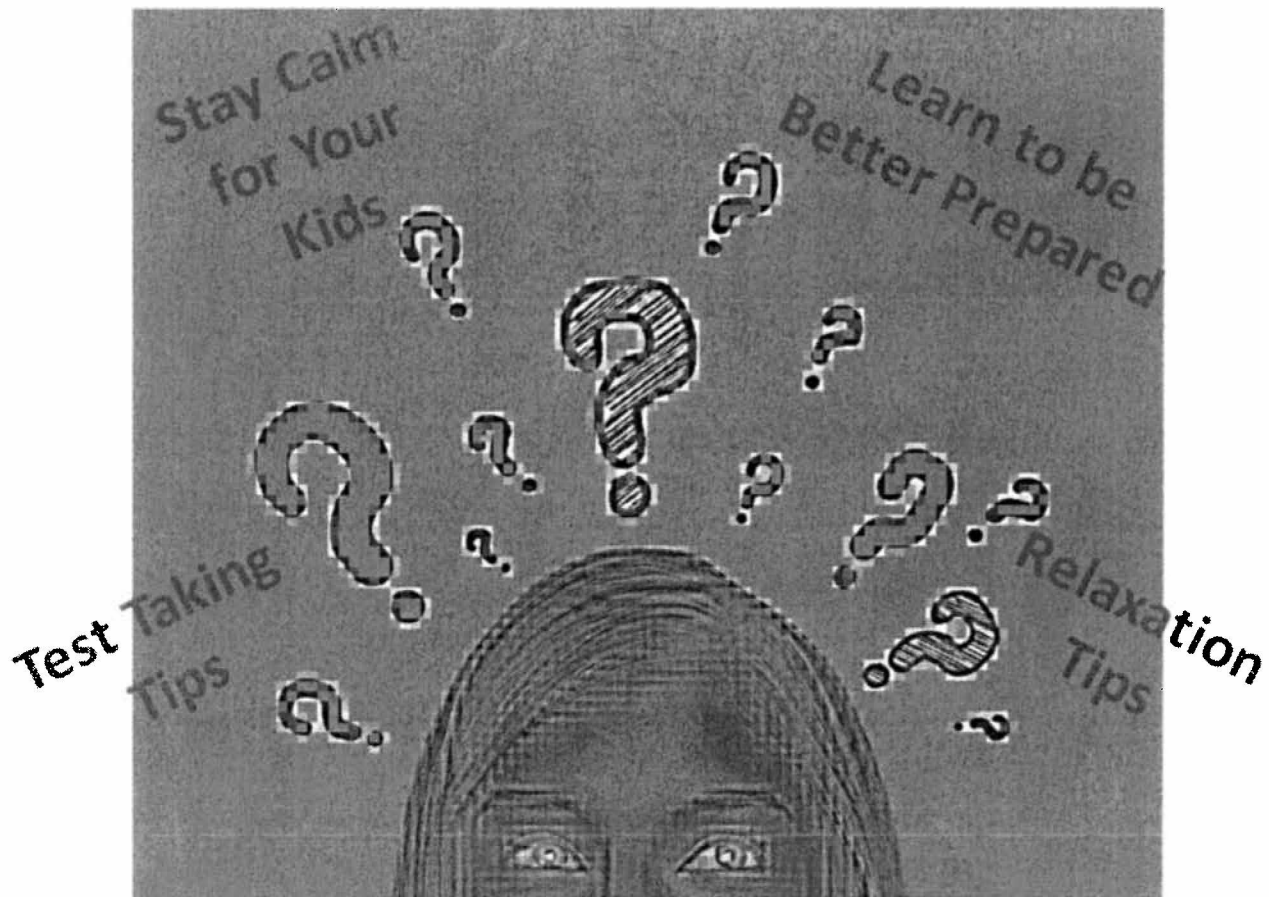

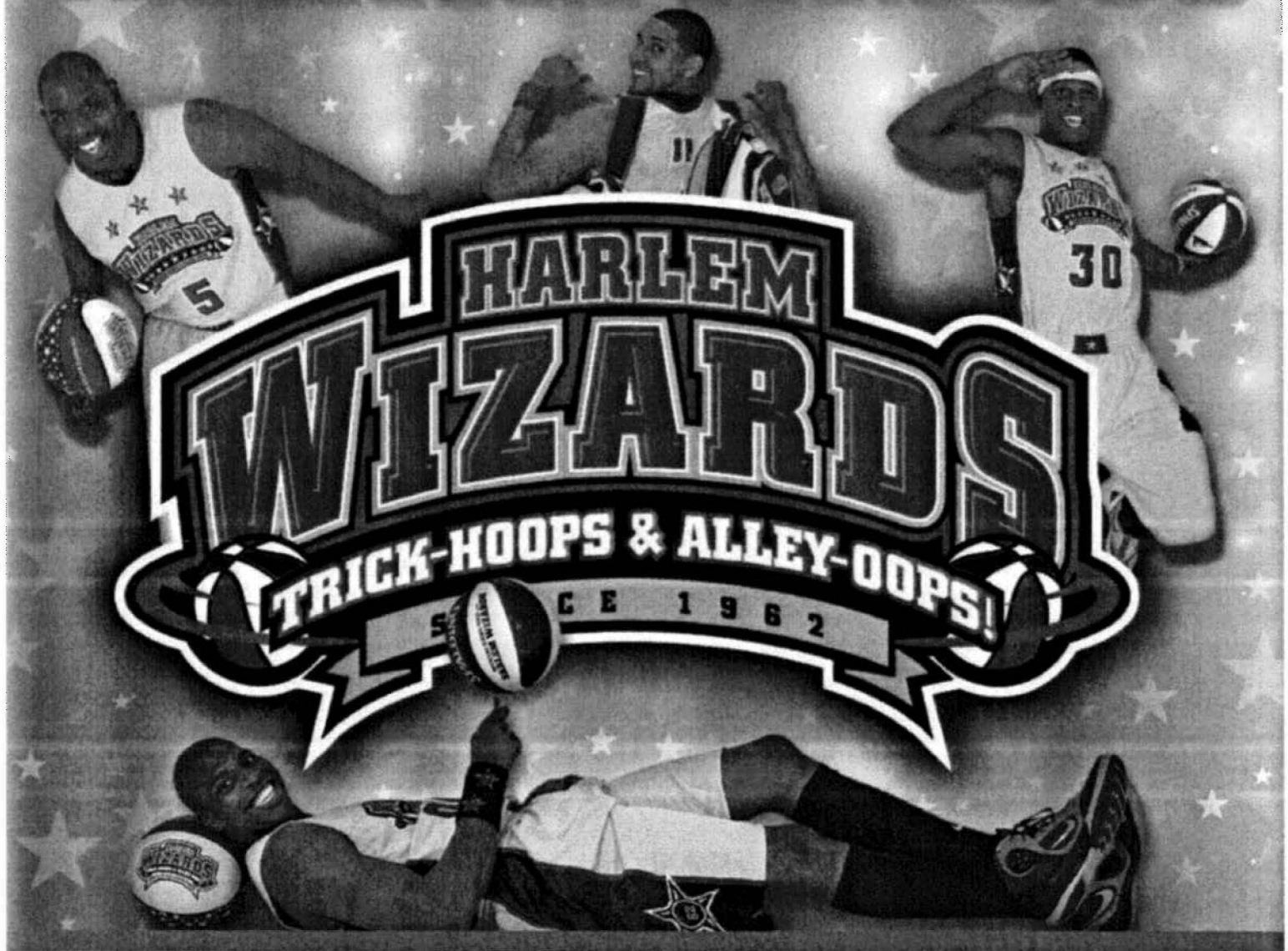
