Remember to bring your reusable shopping bags every time you go out to run errands. You remember your keys and your phone and to grab the kids sports equipment... grab those bags! Every year, New Yorkers discard over nine BILLION single use plastics bags totaling 100,000 TONS of solid waste! You see them everywhere they shouldn't be, in the trees, the streets, the parks and clogging our storm drains. They never decompose and just become part of giant plastic islands of sludge. These bags are made from petroleum and other non-renewable fossil fuels. Every year in the US, twelve MILLION barrels of oil are used to make single-use plastic bags.
