- Go to: https://images.schoolannualonline.com/login
- If it does not automatically log you into the site, enter username: 403403588
- Browse to select the photo(s) you wish to upload.
- Very Important Enter information about the photo ie: names **and** what grade the students were in when the photo was taken. If the photo you are uploading is from Symbols of America, which LH performed in 2nd grade, indicate "2nd Grade" and your child's name. If we cannot identify a photo we will not be able to use it.
 - Click "Save Details".
