THE BUDGET IS <u>BELOW</u> THE TAX LEVY LIMIT.



- Is <u>BELOW</u> the NYS tax levy limit, at a 1.64% proposed increase.
- Maintains <u>all programs</u> and initiatives.
- Preserves <u>current class size</u> guidelines.



- Adds <u>new course offerings</u> at the Jr./Sr. High School to enhance academic programming including dual enrollment opportunities for college credit. Also, creates <u>new special education</u> <u>programming</u>.
- Continues the <u>vast co-curricular</u>, <u>athletic</u>, <u>and arts</u> offerings.

- Funds the building of a walking track at both West Side and Lloyd Harbor, half of which is being paid using a generous state grant from our local legislator.
- Supports the <u>arts</u> with funds for <u>programming</u>, a <u>partnership</u> with the Huntington Arts Council, and an Art Honor Society.
- Provides additional flexible furniture options at all levels to promote collaboration, critical thinking, and research.
- Equips the new state-of-the-art STEAM wing at the Jr./Sr. High School with 3-D printers, laser cutter, and other fabrication machines.

 Includes <u>extensive professional development</u> for teachers, including a robust mentoring program, conferences, and other learning opportunities.

 Maintains the <u>partnership with the DNA Learning Center and CSH</u> Laboratory to enrich science experiences for students.

 Provides <u>digital materials for students</u> <u>and staff</u>, including the *Canvas Learning Management System*, online textbooks, and resource materials.




- Replaces outdated technology with <u>new computers</u>, <u>Promethean</u> Boards, servers, and other devices.

- Includes funds for an interior school bus camera program.




TAX LEVY LIMITS
