Dear Students and Families:

Teachers consider each student's current progress to suggest the courses that offer the best chance for future success. While recommendations are specific to each subject area, they are ultimately reviewed in the context of the student's overall program during their course selection meeting with the school counselor in January or February.

As students and families navigate teacher recommendations, course offerings, and the academic program for 2025–2026, please remember there are many resources and people available to support you. School counselors, teachers, and building leaders are here to help, as are the *Program of Study, Scope and Sequence documents, and grade-specific course planning materials.*

Important Dates to Remember

COURSE SELECTION TIMELINE

I. December 2024:

- ⇒ Teachers make course recommendations for individual students in all core courses. Course recommendations will be visible on the eSchool student/parent portal on December 20, 2024.
- ⇒ Program of Study and individual grade-specific scheduling sheets are available for students/ families to review and use to plan a list of requested courses.

II. January/February 2025:

⇒ School counselors meet with students to review course recommendations and choose elective courses. Parents are encouraged to participate.

III. March 5, 2025:

⇒ Course requests will be locked and master schedule build will begin. Changes to course requests will not be made after this date; level changes will be reviewed as needed.

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December Counseling Center Programs

Grade 11 College Planning Kick-Off Parent/ Student Workshop

Monday, December 2 at 7pm in the PAC

Choosing a college and preparing for the application process involves many important steps and decisions. This parent/student program is designed to offer valuable guidance on navigating this journey. We will review the key activities and milestones families will encounter in the coming months, including an introduction to using Naviance for college exploration and planning.

Classroom Counseling Sessions

In December, counselors will host the second of three classroom sessions to support students at key milestones in their academic journey. For grade 11 students, these sessions will officially launch the college exploration process, providing an overview of the steps and resources available to guide them. Grade 8 students will participate in sessions focused on time management and high school planning, building on the topics covered during the recent Parent/Student Night for 8th-grade families.

The counseling department's approach ensures all students receive essential information in classroom or group settings, followed by opportunities for more personalized support through individual or small-group meetings tailored to their unique interests, needs, and plans.



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PSAT....Now What?

PSAT/NMSQT scores were released by the College Board in early November. Students in grades 10 and 11 who took the PSAT/NMSQT in October are now able to view their score reports. Students can log into their College Board account for their full report. Also, scores have been uploaded into Naviance and can be viewed there. Counselors have connected with each student who took the PSAT to ensure they are able to access their scores and understand how to read the report. This brief video can also help guide students through the score report.

The PSAT was a practice exam. Students in grade 10 had an early look into the testing process and the new digital exam while juniors can use their score report to help determine their next steps in the college testing cycle. The digital SAT exam is shorter (2 hours instead of 3) and includes an adaptive model whereby questions students receive later in the exam are determined by how they answer questions in the first module of the exam.

There are many practice test options available to students. CSH students have two *FREE* ways to practice and prepare for both the Digital SAT and the upcoming ACT exams.

- 1. As of December 7 All CSH students can take a : *FREE Practice SAT and ACT* through the Princeton Review. The tests will be taken online at home and results will be provided immediately.
- 2. All Cold Spring Harbor HS students also have access to the *free* Methodize Test Prep Program. Students can access this program through the menu in their Castle Learning accounts. Methodize provides SAT and ACT prep tools including diagnostic tests, full length exams, a vocabulary builder and a complete self-paced preparation program for both exams SAT and ACT with informative videos and instruction on specific test question types with tips to address them. Grade 8 Parent/Student Evening Program

A student's high school course schedule is an opportunity to engage in challenging, rewarding, and personally meaningful academic experiences. Thoughtful planning ensures a balance between rigorous coursework and opportunities for success. As you consider your options, think about your four-year high school plan and long-term academic goals. Here are some guiding questions to reflect on:

- Which subjects do I find most engaging?
- Where do I excel, and what are my strengths?
- What challenges me in a way that promotes growth?
- How much time can I realistically dedicate to my coursework and other commitments?



The choices made during the course selection process shape both individual schedules and the school's master schedule. It's important to carefully consider the level of rigor for each course, the total demands of your schedule, and your ability to maintain a healthy balance between academics and extracurricular activities.

Ultimately, your transcript will reflect the courses you've taken and the grades you've earned, so thoughtful planning with your goals in mind can set the stage for success.

Dear Class of 2025 Families,

We are pleased to announce that the Beta version of the 2025-2026 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is now available, offering a more streamlined and user-friendly experience for students to begin their applications.

The full version of the FAFSA application is expected to launch on December 1, 2024.

Completing the FAFSA is a crucial step in accessing financial aid for higher education, including:

- Federal grants
- Federal loans
- State and institutional scholarships
- Work-study opportunities

Even if you believe your family may not qualify for need-based aid, many colleges and universities require the FAF-SA for consideration of merit-based scholarships.

We strongly encourage families to complete the FAFSA as early as possible to maximize financial aid opportunities. You can access the application here.

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WS BOCES: Wilson Tech

Each year, some of our students from Cold Spring Harbor High School join peers from 17 other school districts in the towns of Babylon, Smithtown, and Huntington to develop skills that are in high demand by employers. These students participate in Western Suffolk BOCES' Wilson Tech career and technical education programs for half of their school day while continuing their academic courses at CSH for the other half. Options include technical careers (i.e., Robotics), health careers (i.e., Nurse Assistant), transportation careers (i.e., Aviation), and construction careers (i.e., Architectural and Design/CAD), among others.

On Monday, December 16, a representative from WS BOCES Wilson Tech will visit the counseling center during periods 2 and 3 (8:34 - 9:58 AM) to meet with interested students. Please complete the Wilson Tech Info. Session Interest Form if you would like to attend this informative meeting. During this session, students can learn about the variety of program options and have their questions answered. Some programs have articulation agreements with several colleges and universities, which means students can potentially earn and transfer college credits to participating colleges.
