<u>Civil Service</u>: created to get rids of the Spoils System <u>People had to be qualified</u> to get a government job.



Boss Tweed: a Political Boss in NYC.




 Stole \$200 million from city

- 3. **Recall**: vote elected official out of office.
- 4. **Referendum**: people vote directly for a law.



- ✓ African-Americans should learn a trade
- ✓ Slow equality

W.E.B. DuBois



- ✓ should fight against discrimination
- ✓ founded the <u>NAACP</u>
- ✓ Rapid equality



NAACP – National Association for the Advancement of Colored People

Worked for the rights of African-Americans

<u>Mexican Americans:</u> famine and political unrest led to increase in immigration to the U.S.

paid lower wages

not able to get good jobs

Mutualistas: collected money to <u>help families</u> that needed it.



Asian Americans

<u>President Roosevelt</u> had a <u>"Gentlemen's Agreement"</u>
 with <u>Japan</u> to <u>stop sending workers</u> to the U.S.



Religious Minorities

Anti-Defamation League:

Founded by American Jews

→ Work to *promote understanding*

Fight prejudice against Jews
