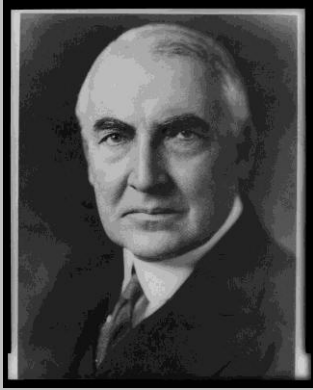

- “Return to Normalcy” = make U.S. the way it was before WWI.
- Many scandals in his administration

Teapot Dome Scandal

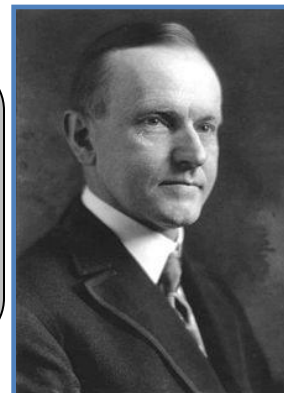
Secretary of the Interior leases gov’t land to oil man.

Takes a bribe → went to prison



President Calvin Coolidge

Restored people’s trust in the government.



United States returned to ISOLATIONISM (Foreign Policy)

The RED SCARE



- Americans feared that COMMUNISM would take over.
- Strikes and bombings by anarchists (hated the government).

Sacco & Vanzetti

- Italian immigrants accused of robbery and murder.
- Little evidence against them
- Found guilty and executed

- Lost jobs to foreigners

U.S. government bans alcohol

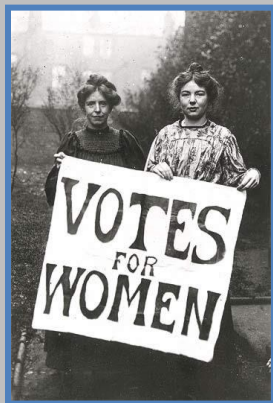
Bootleggers
