


Southern states secede






Section 1: The Call to Arms

Border States:

- slave states that <u>DID NOT secede</u>



- **√** Missouri
- **√** Kentucky
- ✓ West Virginia
- ✓ Maryland
- **✓** Delaware

Southern Advantages (the CONFEDERACY)

- they fought in own territory
- very <u>experienced military officers</u>





Northern Advantages (the UNION)

- many factories to make military goods
- *more railroad* lines
- more farmland
- larger population








The <u>NORTH was better prepare</u>d to fight a war


First Battle of Bull Run

- many people felt the North would win easily
- the Confederacy defeats the Union

Ironclads Guns Cannons


General George McClellan (UNION)

- put in command after Bull Run
- waited to attack the Confederates
- finally attacked but <u>did not pursue</u> <u>the Confederates</u>



General Ulysses S. Grant (UNION)

- led a successful army
- very <u>aggressive general</u>

Horace Greeley


- an *abolitionist newspaper publisher*



Emancipation Proclamation

- issued by <u>President Lincoln</u>
- frees enslaved people in the rebelling states
- changed the war into a struggle for freedom
- led many African-Americans to volunteer for the Union army






Section 4: The Civil War and American Life

The Draft

- requires a citizen to serve in the military
- both the NORTH and SOUTH had a draft





You could HIRE a SUBSTITUTE to serve for you in the military!

Draft Riots

- <u>riots</u> broke out <u>in major cities in the North</u>
- people were <u>angry about the draft</u>





Women in the War

- some <u>disguised themselves to fight</u>
- some were <u>spies</u>
- many <u>supported families</u>








Section 5: Decisive Battles

Gettysburg

- <u>3 day</u>battle
- victory for the North



Vicksburg

- <u>Union defeats the Confederacy</u>
- North takes control of all of the Mississippi River



Gettysburg Address

- President *Lincoln speaks a battlefield* dedication

"......Four score and seven year ago.......and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from


the earth."

Sherman's March to the Sea


- General Sherman marches Union troops to the Atlantic ocean
- They <u>destroy everything</u> in their path





Appomattox Courthouse

- April 9, 1865
- the South surrenders to the North



As a result of the war....



> The Confederacy lost about 260,000 soldiers



➤ The *Union lost* about <u>360,000 soldiers</u>

➤ The <u>nation was reunited</u>

> Slavery was ended
